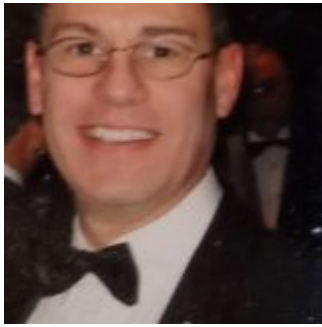


# William “Bill” J. Moldthan II

William J. Moldthan, II, (Bill), passed away December 17, 2021, at the Hospice of Baton Rouge Butterfly Wing after a courageous battle with cancer at 67 years of age. He was proud of the beautiful flowers and trees he grew in his yard which were quite spectacular. He visited almost every state including Alaska and Hawaii as well as Greece, Italy, and Ireland. He always said his favorite trip was the one he was planning next. His latest interest involved raising finches and tropical fish. Bill was very devout and participated in the choir at Our Lady of Mercy for over 30 years.

Bill is survived by his partner of 40 years Ken Haydell; four siblings, Suzanne (Richard), Dennis (Ann), Timothy (Claire) and David (Stacey), as well as many nieces and nephews.
