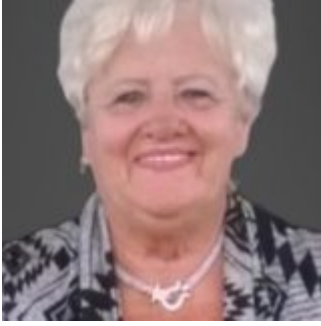


# Connie Bea McMorris Pendarvis
