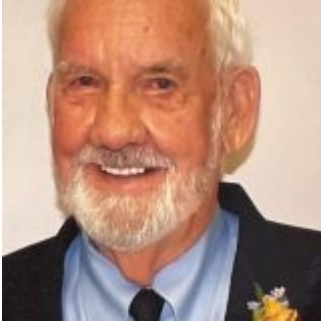


# Richard A. Nettles
