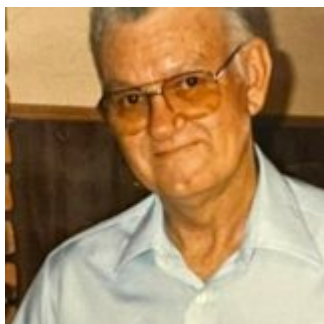


Noel Karith Palmer
