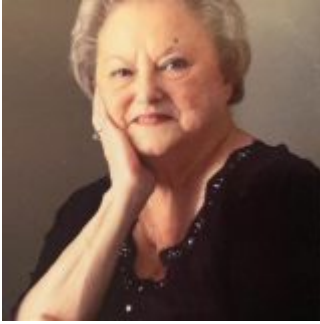


Garland Melanie Moore (Mama)
