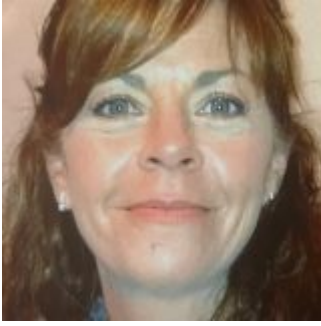


Vickie Lynn Sullivan
