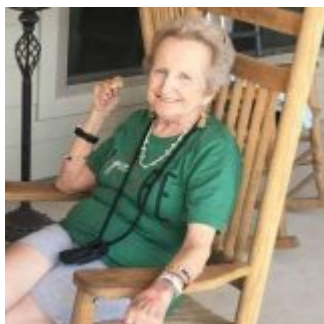


# Mary Nell Methvien Scardina Everett
