
Randee Lane Palmer

After college she went to work for the State of Louisiana in the Dept. of Public Welfare. The last 10 years of her career she worked as a Child Welfare Specialist, requiring considerable travel. She retired after 33 years.

Randee was a generous, kind and friendly person. She was an excellent record keeper, documenting most events important to her and her family. She loved cats her entire life. Most childhood photos show her holding a kitten. She lived with her cat "Bitsy" for seventeen years. Randee also had a wonderful sense of humor. She loved reading until she couldn't see, then she began listening to books on tape.

During her last ten years Randee suffered from severe Macular Degeneration and Alzheimer's. She relied on her family and caretaker to enable her to remain in her home. She grew to love her sweet caretaker, Jennifer Mason, her husband and two sons, Dylan and Kamryn. They gave her lots of hugs and brought joy into her life. Randee loved the boys as if they were her own grandchildren. She was truly happy.

She will be missed greatly by her family and friends.
