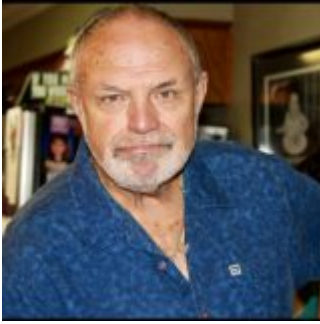


Harlan Lester “Les” Reynolds
