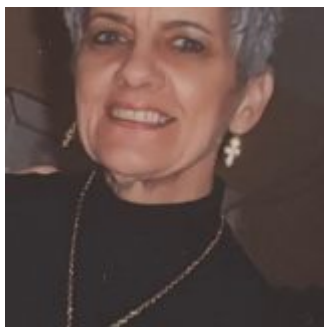


Mary Alice Courville Singleton
